Statement of Requirements

The bachelor of arts degree in anthropology requires a minimum of 12 anthropology courses of at least 3 credit hours each, with a minimum of a C average in the major. A maximum combined total of 8 hours of ANT 397R (Directed Readings), ANT 495 (Honors), and ANT 497R (Undergraduate Research) may be applied toward the major. Only one 100-level course may be used to satisfy the BA requirements (no more than 4 credits). No courses taken using the S/U option may be applied toward the major. A maximum of 12 credit hours earned off campus may be applied toward the major. A maximum of 2 courses may double-count for both the Anthropology BA and another major or minor. Note: Petitions for course substitutions and exceptions will be considered by the Anthropology Undergraduate Concerns Committee.

The courses required for the BA must be distributed as follows:

Required Courses:

- (1) Anthropology 201: Concepts and Methods in Biological Anthropology
- (2) Anthropology 202: Concepts and Methods in Cultural Anthropology

It is strongly recommended that ANT 201 and 202 be taken in the sophomore year, if possible, so they may serve as building blocks for further coursework.

- (3) One course from the ANT 280R: *Anthropological Perspectives on a World Area* series.

Electives: Any Anthropology course or course cross-listed with Anthropology may count as an elective toward the Anthropology BA degree. Course offerings for each term may be found in the Course Atlas.

Anthropology Requirements Earned Off Campus

Maximum is 12 credit hours of approved coursework, including study abroad. Courses must be at least 3 credits each.
