**Statement of Requirements**

The bachelor of arts degree in anthropology requires a minimum of twelve Anthropology courses of at least 3 credits each (minimum 36 total semester hours), as detailed on the reverse. A minimum of a C average in the major is required for completion.

**Additional Details:**

- Courses may not be used to satisfy more than one requirement. For example, courses being used for the Introductory, Foundational/Area, or Capstone requirements may not be used toward the Concentration. ANT 201 and 204 may satisfy EITHER the Introductory requirement OR the Foundational requirement.
- Only one 100-level course may be used to satisfy the BA requirements (no more than 4 credits).
- A maximum combined total of 8 credits (2 courses) of ANT 397R (Directed Readings), ANT 495 (Honors), and ANT 497R (Undergraduate Research) may be applied toward the major.
- No courses taken using the S/U option may be applied toward the major.
- Students are encouraged to study abroad. Up to 4 courses taken off the Emory campus (ie study abroad or transfer courses) may be approved to count toward major requirements. Courses must be at least 3 credits each and approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
- A maximum of 8 credits (2 courses) may double-count for both the Anthropology BA and another major or minor.
- Petitions for course substitutions and exceptions will be considered by the Anthropology Undergraduate Concerns Committee.

**Anthropology Requirements Earned Off Campus**

Maximum is 4 courses, including transfer courses and study abroad. Courses must be at least 3 credits each and approved by the Director of Undergraduate Studies.
